Helping Residents During COVID . . .

You have made it possible for us to help our residents remain safe and healthy. Not only has Windy Hill facilitated the delivery of between 45 and 60 boxes of food every other week to three of our sites in Loudoun and Fauquier Counties, but Windy Hill staff members have been dedicated to ensuring that all of our residents have other critical supplies and masks, as well as access to testing.

We can proudly say that our older and most vulnerable adult residents are almost all vaccinated. Thanks to partnerships with the Town of Middleburg and the Loudoun County Health Department, our residents, along with other members of the Middleburg community, were able to access vaccines at the Middleburg Safeway and with local EMT's at a "pop-up" clinic at Levis Hill House. Nearly all those who are eligible and want to receive the vaccine have had at least their first dose.

Thanks to you, and partners such as Seven Loaves, The Salvation Army, The Blue Ridge Food Bank, Dulles South Food Pantry, and many others, our residents have had constant access to healthy food.

We are so excited to announce that families and older adults living at Llewellyn Village and Levis Hill House in Middleburg now have consistent access to the internet. Your support, along with a grant from Loudoun County, allowed us to build Wi-Fi hot spots at these two locations so our families and older adults are able to access important resources and on-line learning.

Our youngest residents have also been touched by your gifts. To keep our students' brains and hands busy, our Resident Services staff has been providing Windy Hill's children with after-school take-home activity kits 5 days a week. The kits are designed to provide 30-minutes of independent activity for students and cover subjects such as math, literacy, STEM, movement, and art. After-school kits have also been distributed weekly in Fauquier County as part of the Horizons program. We hope we can start our in-person after-school programming in all of our communities very soon.



The Middleburg Business and Professional Association (MBPA) hosted a "Fox Sox" drive in the month of February. Over 500 new pairs of socks were donated for residents of all ages. Thank you to all the local businesses in Middleburg, especially Journeymen Saddler's Punkin Lee, who supported this effort!

Starting mid-March, there will be a food drive for Seven Loaves in Middleburg which supplies nutritious food for so many families in need in our community. We look forward to your support!
