Prepared for Winter?

Be proactive! The best way to prepare for winter weather is to do so before winter arrives:



At home:

- Locate an emergency heat source, like a fireplace, a wood stove or a space heater
- Store water and canned food
- Have a first aid kit and keep it accessible
- Know where your flashlights and batteries are located
- Look over your insurance policy

In vehicle:

- Have an emergency kit in your vehicle in case you are stranded (*Emergency Kit- Include enough food, water, meds & anything used daily to last for at least 72 hrs*)
- Have a shovel, a windshield scraper and sand or cat litter for traction
- Keep a phone charger, a flashlight and a toolkit in the trunk
- Store food and water in the vehicle

Make a plan to check on neighbors if extreme cold or winter weather knocks out your power.



Power Outage tips:

- Dim the brightness in your cell phone settings to save battery life
- Keep freezers and refrigerators closed
- Disconnect appliances and electronics to avoid damage from electrical surges.
- Go to a community location with power if heat or cold is extreme
